



Faculty Lead, IEM Bridging Program

The UBC Midwifery Program in the Department of Family Practice at the University of British Columbia invites applications for the position of Faculty Lead, Internationally Educated Midwives (IEM) Bridging Program.

Starting in 2015, the IEM Bridging Program at UBC will provide eligible IEMs with the appropriate orientation, training, and assessment to prepare them to undertake the Canadian Midwifery Registration Examination (CMRE). Upon successful completion of the CMRE, IEMs will be eligible for registration with the College of Midwives of British Columbia. An annual intake of eight eligible IEMs is anticipated.

This part-time position will support the instructional needs of the IEM Bridging Program by developing and delivering curriculum in traditional classroom and flexible delivery (i.e., distance) formats as required. It will coordinate all instructional activities, deliver the curriculum, supervise other instructors as needed, liaise with midwifery practices for clinical placements, and conduct assessments. It will contribute to other activities in the Midwifery Program, as requested by the Director. The position holder will report to the Director, UBC Midwifery Program, and will work collaboratively with staff and faculty in that program.

The successful candidate will be a Registered Midwife (or be eligible for registration) in British Columbia, have a Master's degree in a relevant field, significant relevant teaching experience, and clinical experience.
